Detailed Report

The Department of English, in association with IQAC, organized a two-day workshop titled "Training on Drama Techniques for Communication Development" on the 8th and 9th of February 2024. The workshop was led by Ms. Poornima Mohish from S S M College, Rajakkad, and took place in the 3rd Year BBA class at Rajagiri Viswajyothi College of Arts and Applied Sciences (RVCAS). Running from 9:30 AM to 4:30 PM over two days, the workshop offered 12 hours of intensive training to 44 students, aiming to enhance their communication abilities through practical drama techniques. Ms. Anila Roshan Joy was instrumental in coordinating the event, ensuring smooth facilitation and participant engagement.

The workshop's primary objectives were to enhance both verbal and nonverbal communication skills and to foster confidence and public speaking abilities among the participants. Through a variety of drama exercises, such as role-playing, improvisation, and storytelling, students were encouraged to explore new methods of expression. These techniques helped them break down communication barriers, allowing them to articulate thoughts more effectively while using body language to reinforce their messages. Ms. Poornima Mohish provided invaluable insights into the power of performance as a tool for personal and professional growth, emphasizing the role of drama in strengthening the clarity and impact of communication.


